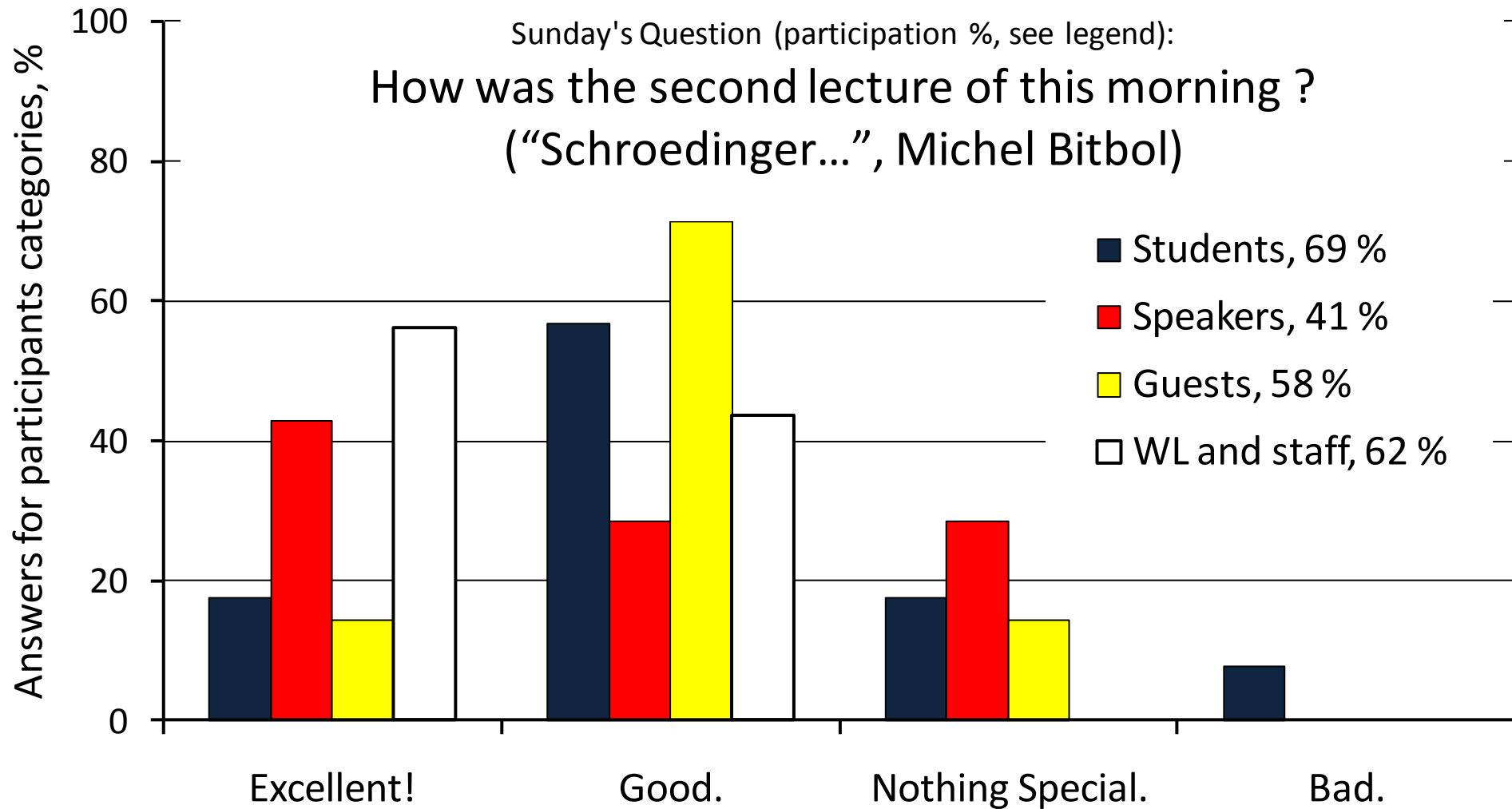

Too many concepts being explained within too little time. Tough to grasp. I would have preferred a single concept in more detail.

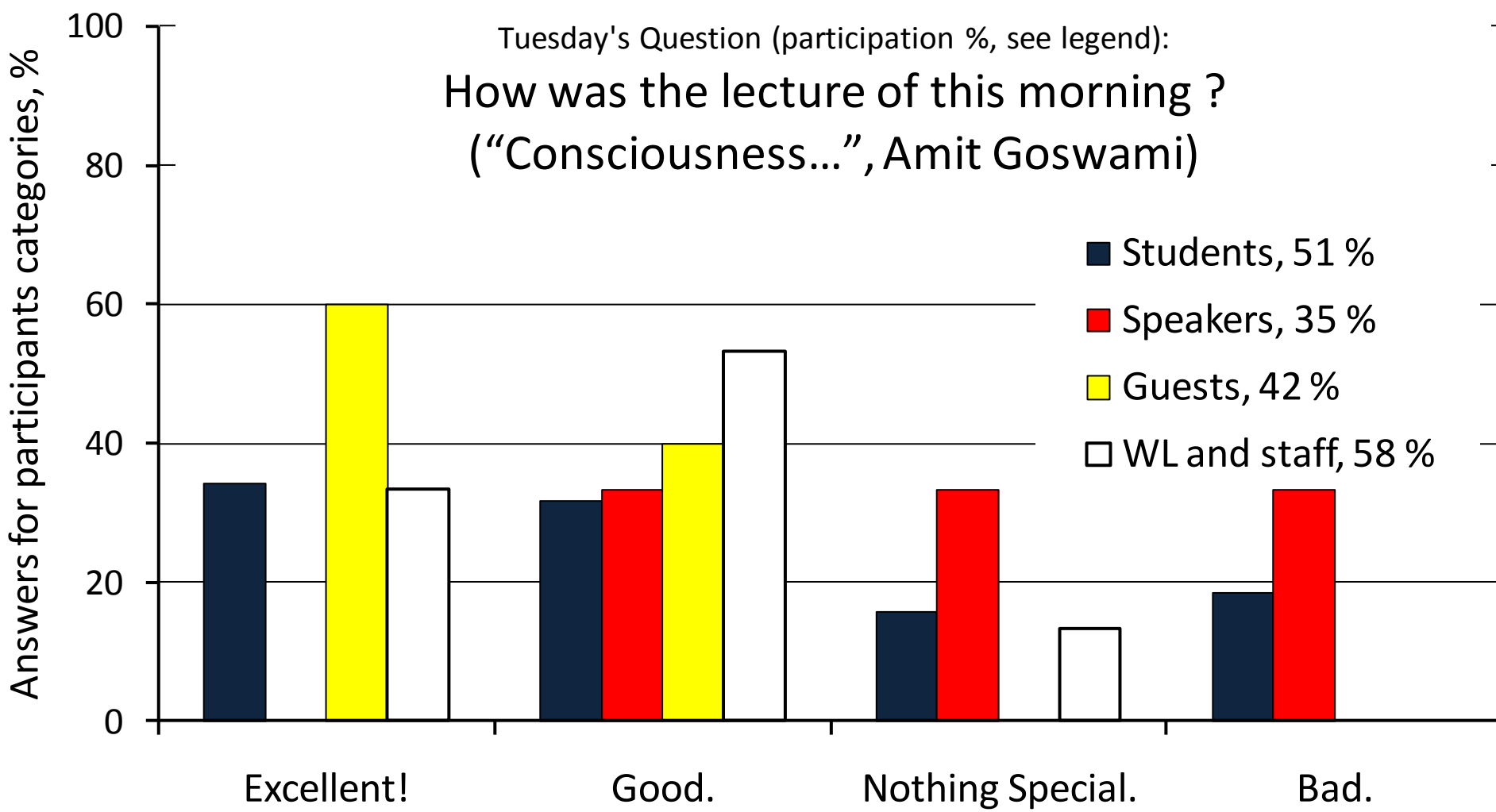

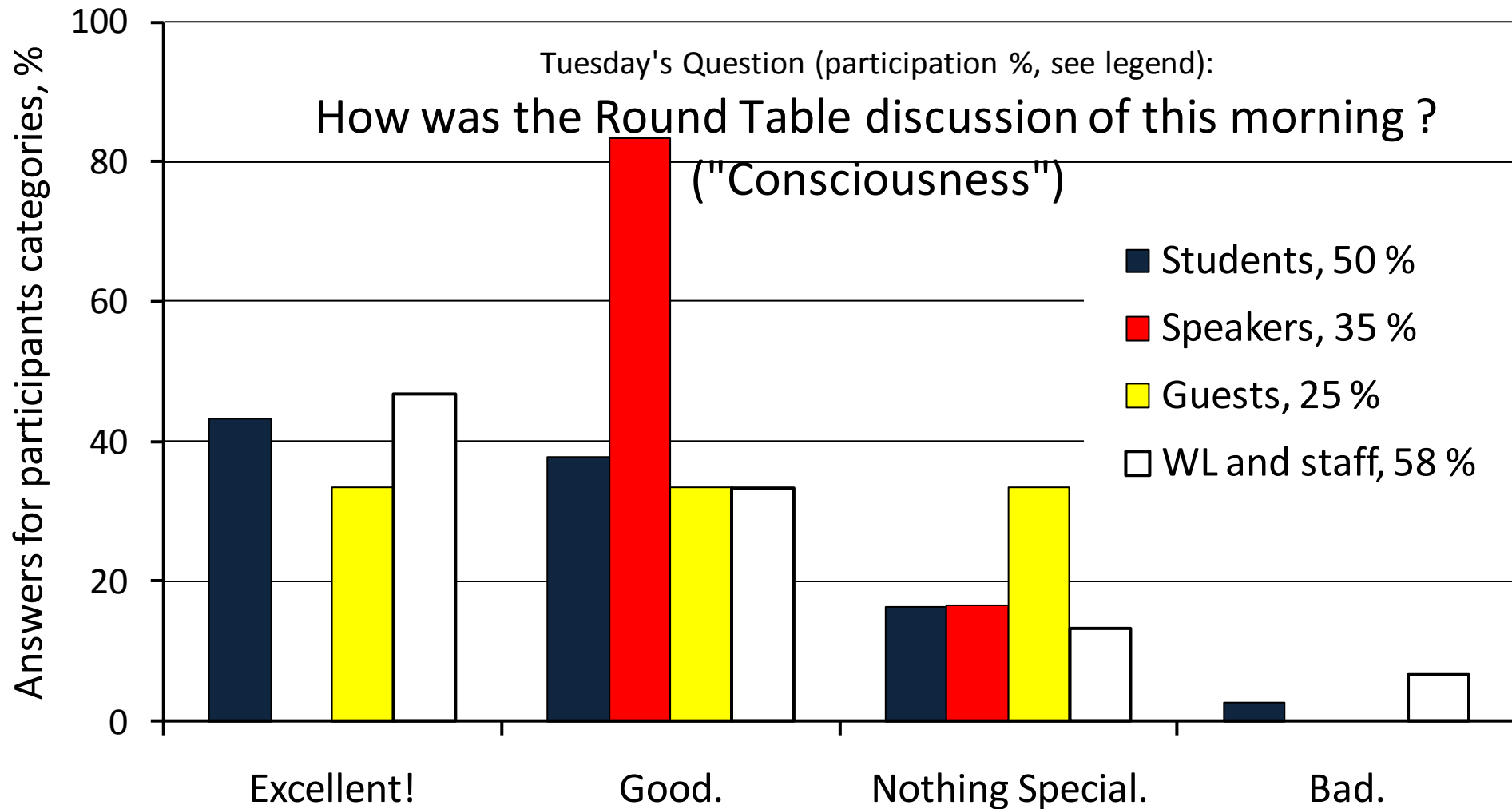

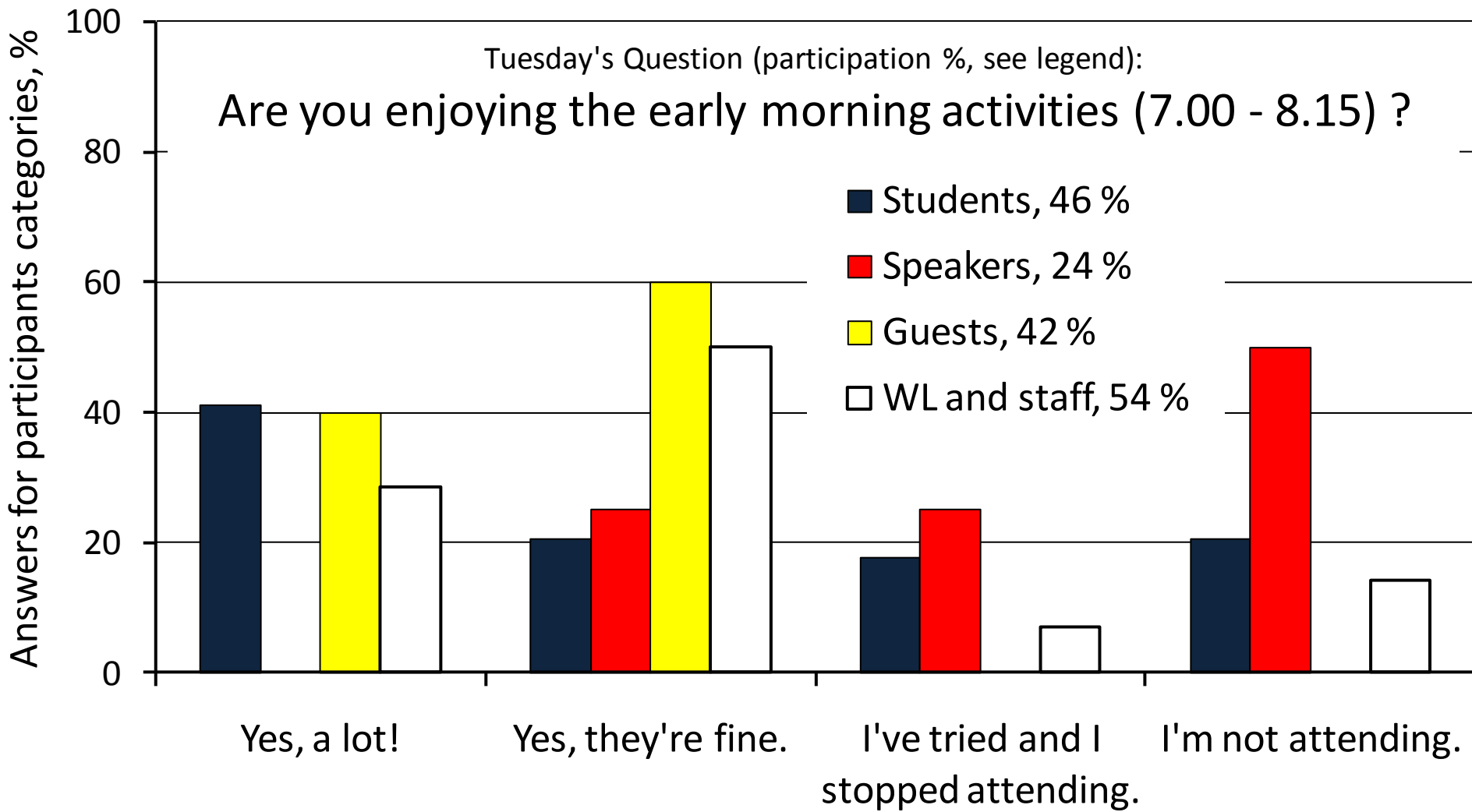

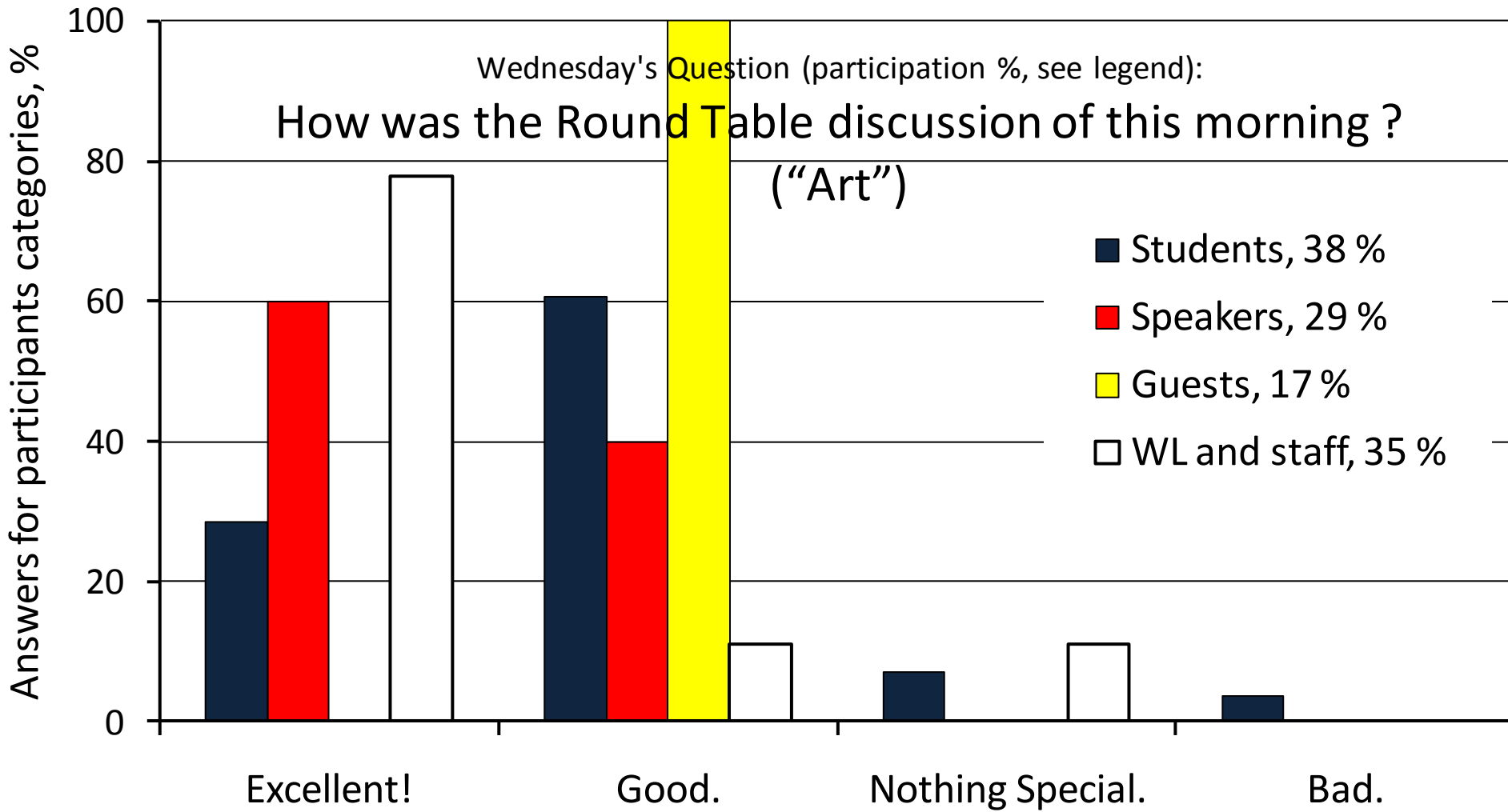

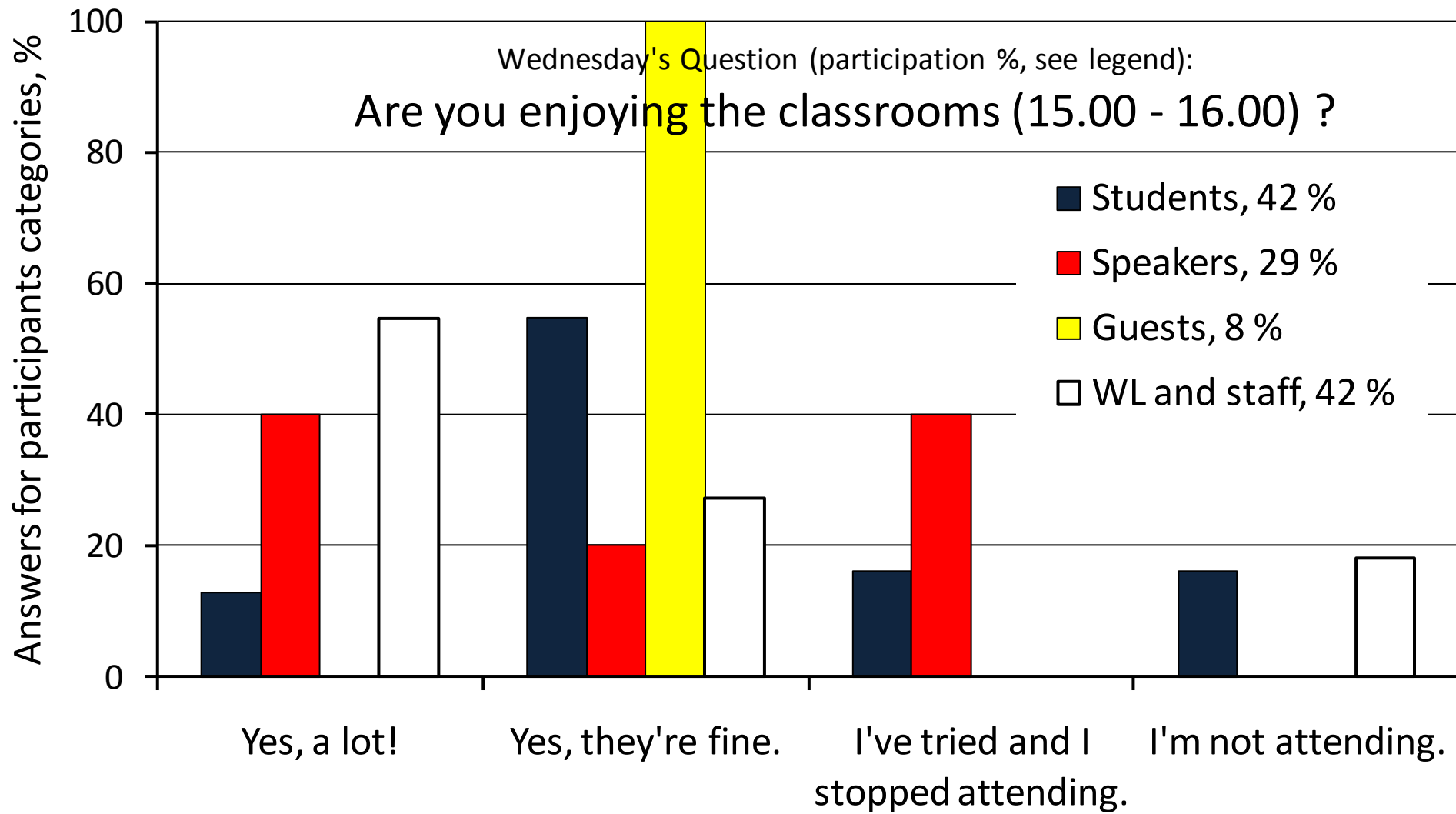

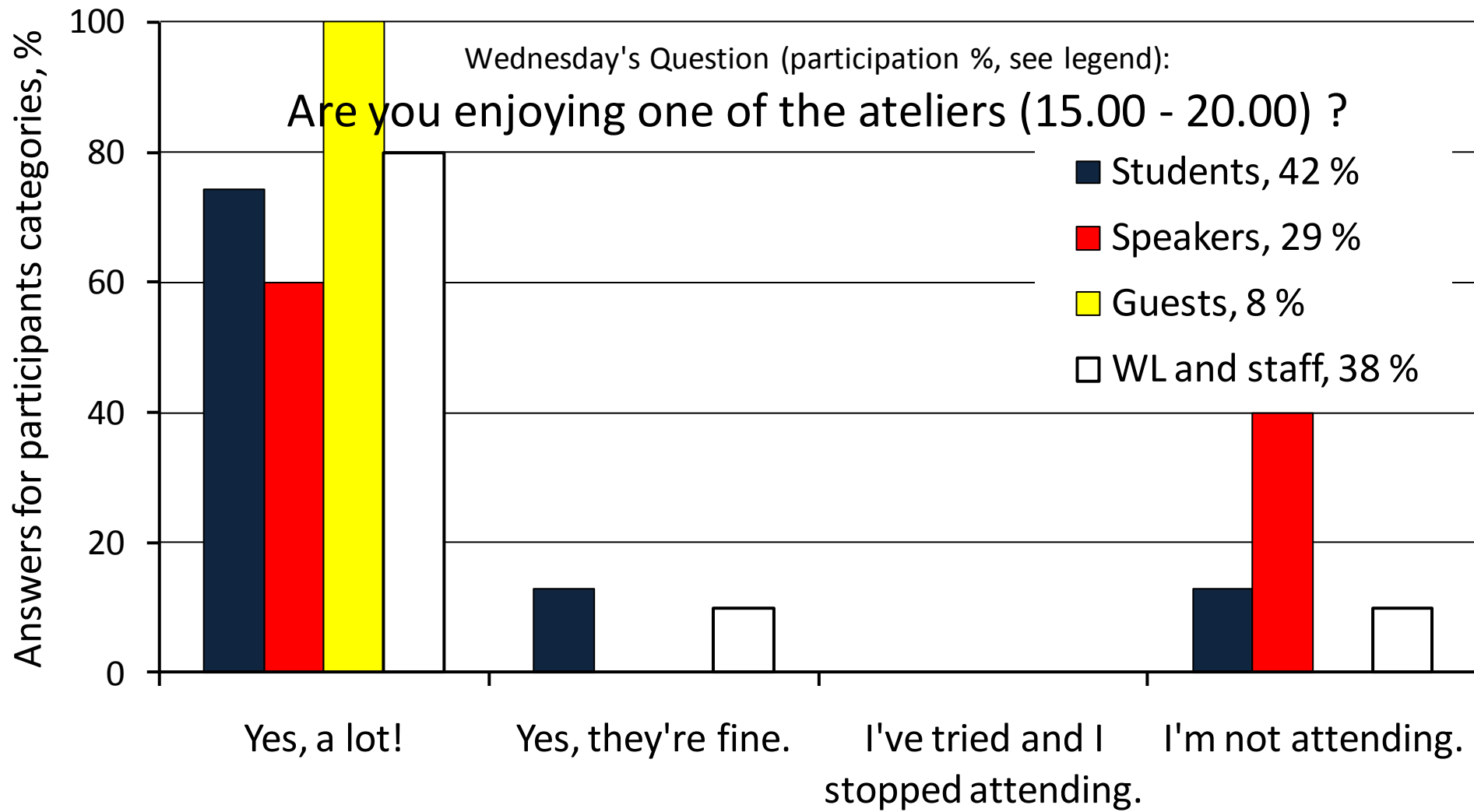

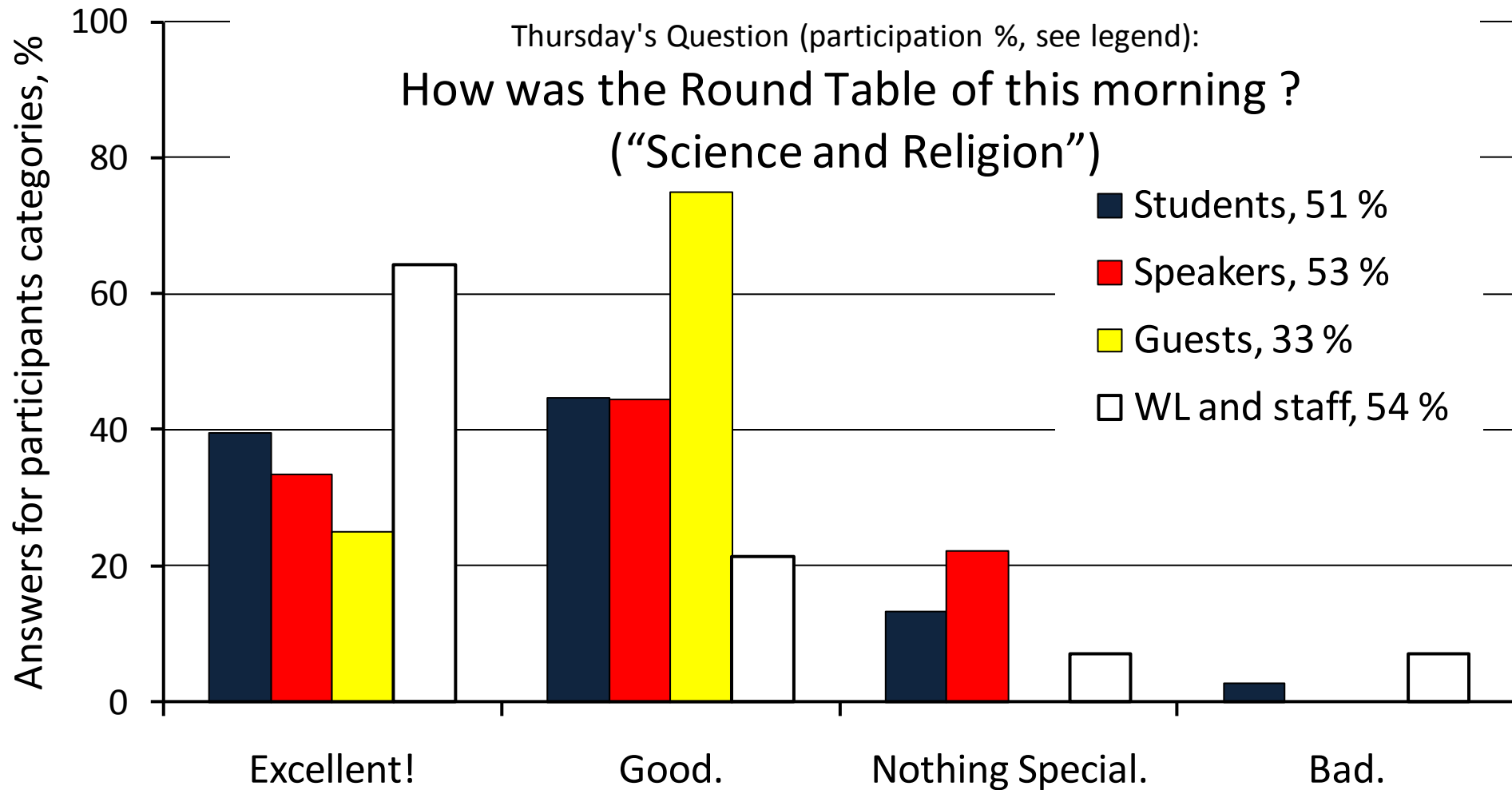

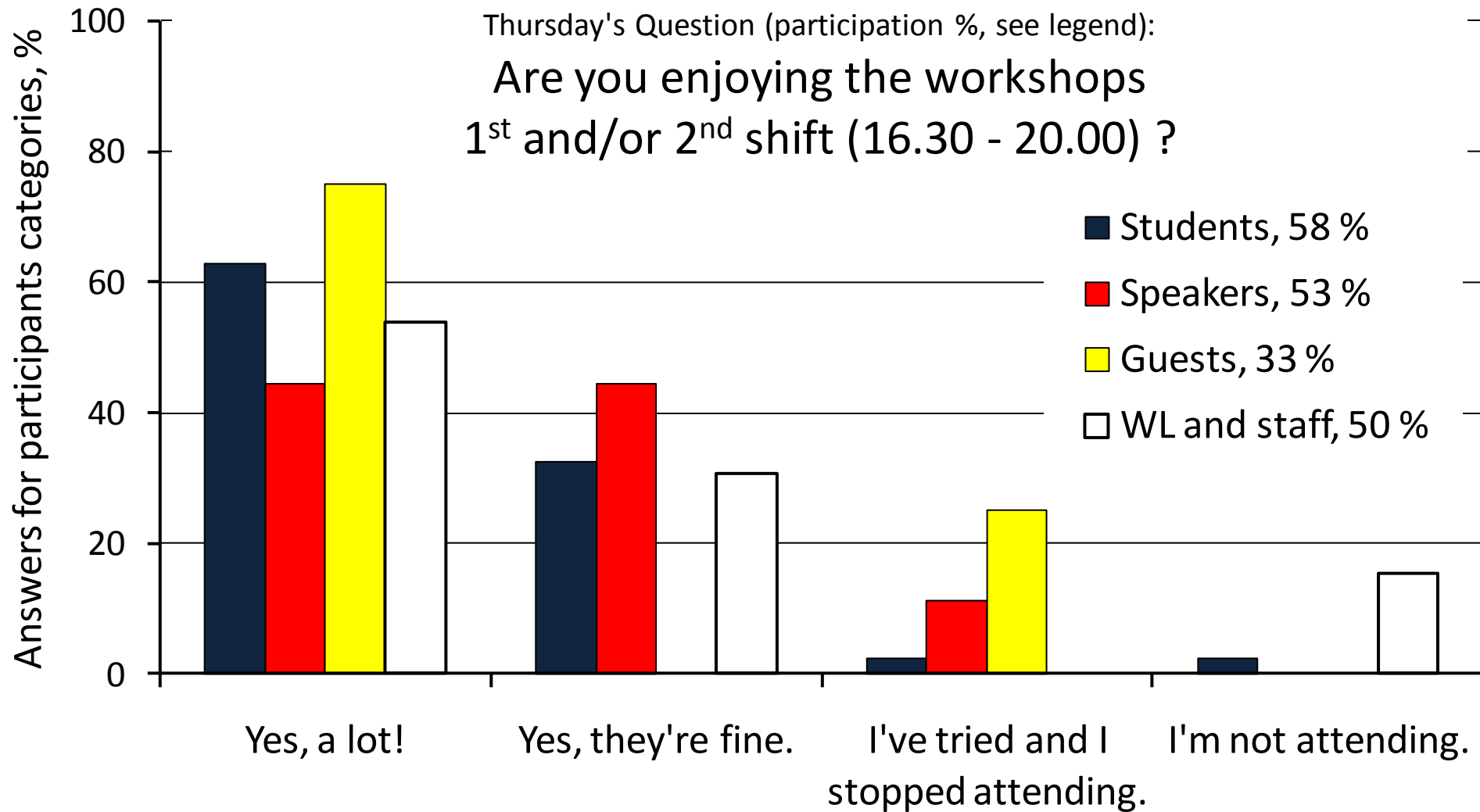

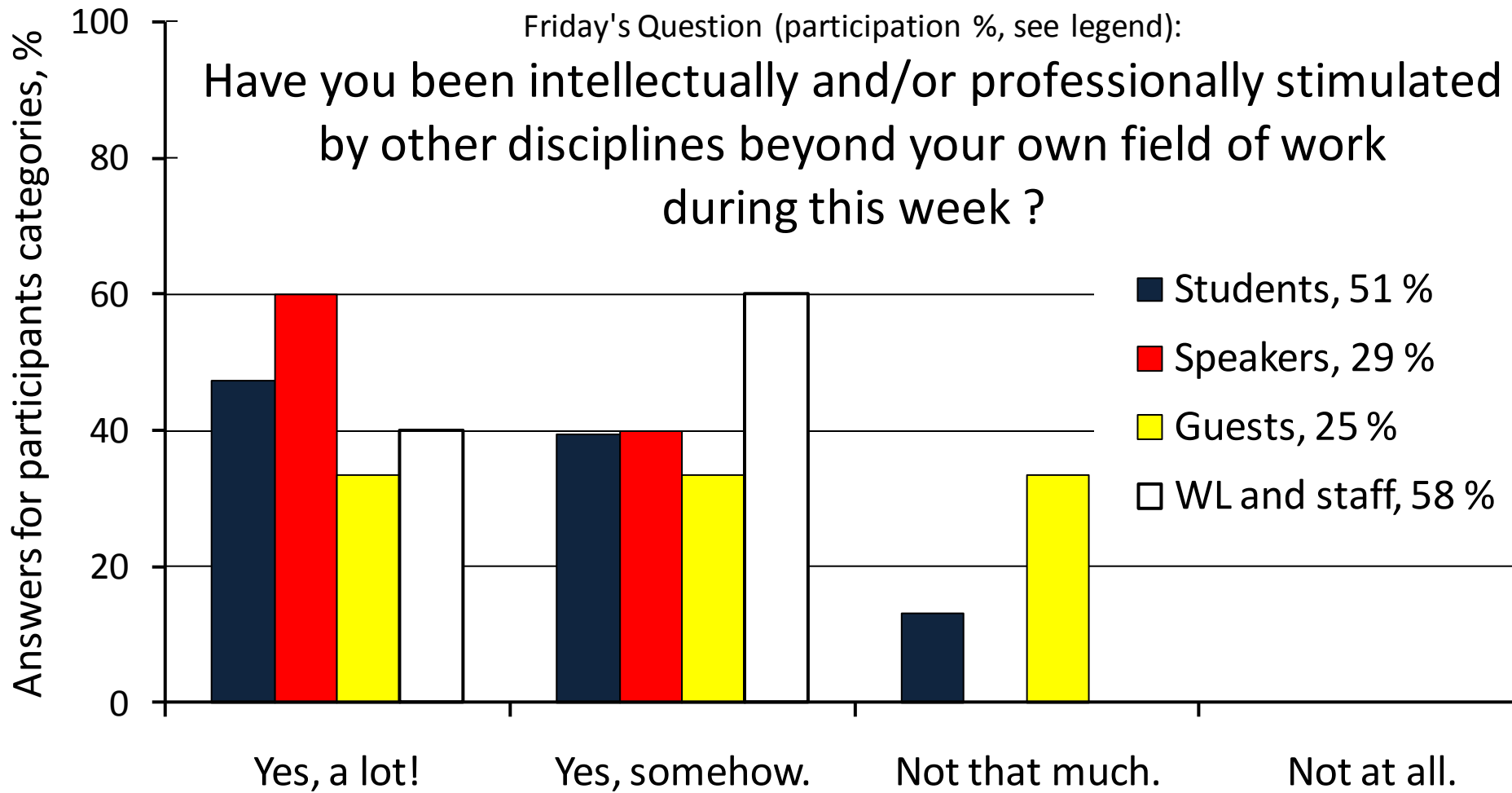

One of the most moving Cortonas, perfectly prepared and organized. Critic: not “spiritual heritage of India”!

Scientists presented mostly their own/private view on spirituality. The Indian heritage was brought in mostly by the students from India.

Why not to give humanities (like a lecture about Hinduism... Islam... Indian Art... psychology...) a place?

I think this would be very important, because the future lies in a new level of bringing together science and humanities.

In my workshop most participants were looking for an orientation they couldn't find in pure of “spiritualized” science. In the Eranos-conferences there was a space for these new horizons on a qualified level because there were highly qualified speakers of science, philosophy, cultural history and depth psychology invited to speak.

On Wednesday: In the mid of the week I feel a deep strong feeling of being homesick – home at Europe. I [*cannot read, sorry*] with happiness that I am European. But this was only a step. Even if we were in this peaceful privileged resort, I came in contact with the social situation in India – poverty, conflicts, fears of the future. This was the background of my home sickness! So this first international Cortona was much closer to real problems in our world and our time. I also had to learn a lot about my prejudices and ignorance about no different cultures. This Cortona-India hopefully opened the door, not only for me. Thank you!
